Under R.C. 4758.02, service cannot be performed without a valid license/certificate that is issued under R.C. Chapter 4758.

<b>TELEHEALTH (Generally)</b>		
License/Certificate (L/C) Holder	<i>At time of service, patient is physically ...</i>	
	<i>In Ohio</i>	<i>Out-Of-State</i>

During a state of emergency, a license/certificate holder from another state can treat an established patient if they are in good standing with their credentialing state and the State of Ohio.
